## Tic-Tac-Toe Instructions

## For Classrooms

1) Draw a Tic-Tac-Toe board on a dry-erase board or poster board or print the one provided on the website (click here).
2) Divide the class into two teams, one team being the " $X$ ' $s$ " and the other team being the " $O$ ' $s$ ".
3) Formulate questions from the lesson to ask the students. If the students answer your questions correctly, then the team may put their $X$ or $O$ on the board wherever they choose. However, if the first team misses the question, then they lose their turn, and the second team gets the opportunity to answer the same question. If they answer the question correctly, they may put their X or O on the board and the teacher moves to the next question. If the second team answers the question incorrectly, then the teacher should give the answer and move to the next question, starting back with the first team.
4) To win Tic-Tac-Toe one of the teams must have either three X's or three O's in a row, whether it is horizontal, vertical, or diagonal.
5) Have fun!

## For Learning Centers

1) Print out Tic-Tac-Toe boards from the A.P. Web site (under Old Testament 1, Part 1, Lesson 1; or click here). It would be wise to laminate the boards after printing them out to make them reusable.
2) Make sure there are two students at each Tic-Tac-Toe board with one of the students representing the "X's" and the other the "O's".
3) Formulate questions from the lesson to ask the students. If the students answer your questions correctly, then the team may put their $X$ or $O$ on the board wherever they choose. However, if the first team misses the question, then they lose their turn, and the second team gets the opportunity to answer the same question. If they answer the question correctly, they may put their X or O on the board and the teacher moves to the next question. If the second team answers the question incorrectly, then the teacher should give the answer and move to the next question, starting back with the first team.
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
